Pricing Information

The Sisters of Saint Joseph have generously subsidised retreat programs at our Centres for many years. The newly formed Mary MacKillop Spirituality Ministry is working towards financial sustainability while also remaining committed to making sure that nobody is unable to attend a retreat due to the cost. To this end, participants who are unable to afford a retreat may apply for a discount or waiver.

Early Bird Discounts

An Early Bird discount of **10% will apply to all Reflection Days and Retreats**. For Reflection Days, to gain an Early Bird discount, you will need to register more than three weeks in advance of the start date of the Reflection Day. For retreats, to gain a 10% discount, you will need to register at least six weeks in advance of the start date of the retreat. **Discounts do not apply to Sabbaticals and Workshops.**

Cancellations Guidelines

From time to time, there will be a need to make a decision as to whether or not a program will run. In the unfortunate situation where a Reflection Day, Retreat, Sabbatical or Workshop is cancelled by the Mary MacKillop Spirituality Ministry, a full refund for the amount paid for the program will be provided to registrants of that program.

If a participant who has registered and paid for a program needs to cancel their registration, a full refund will be provided if the participating centre (where the program is being held), is notified four weeks or more from the start date of the program. **Cancellations made within four weeks of the program start are non-refundable.** The same conditions apply if you need to change the date of the program you are attending.
