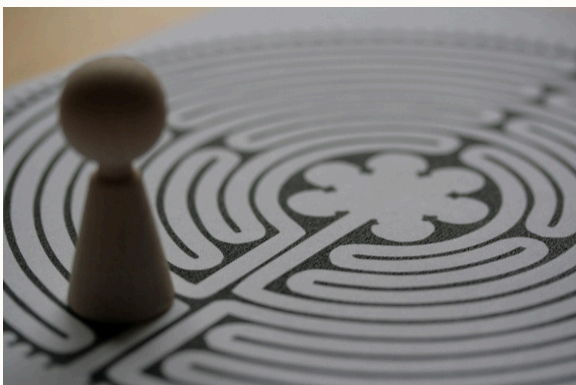

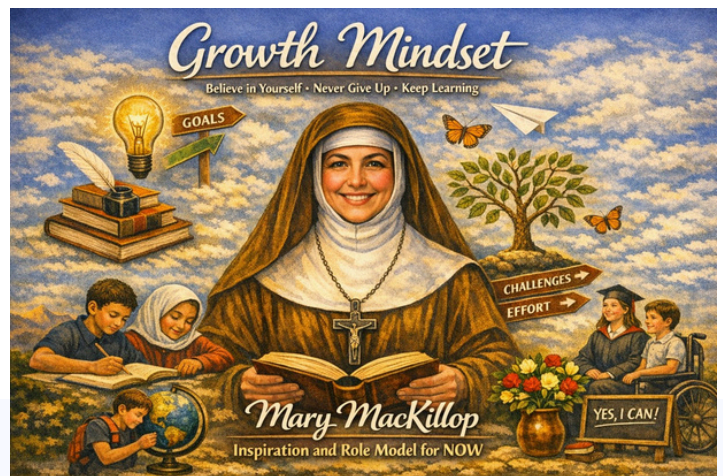

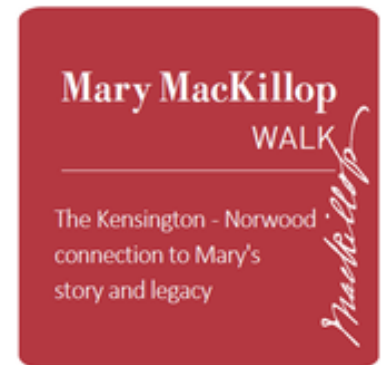
Start your journey: Collect a free self-guided booklet from the Mary MacKillop Museum at 19 Phillips Street, Kensington.

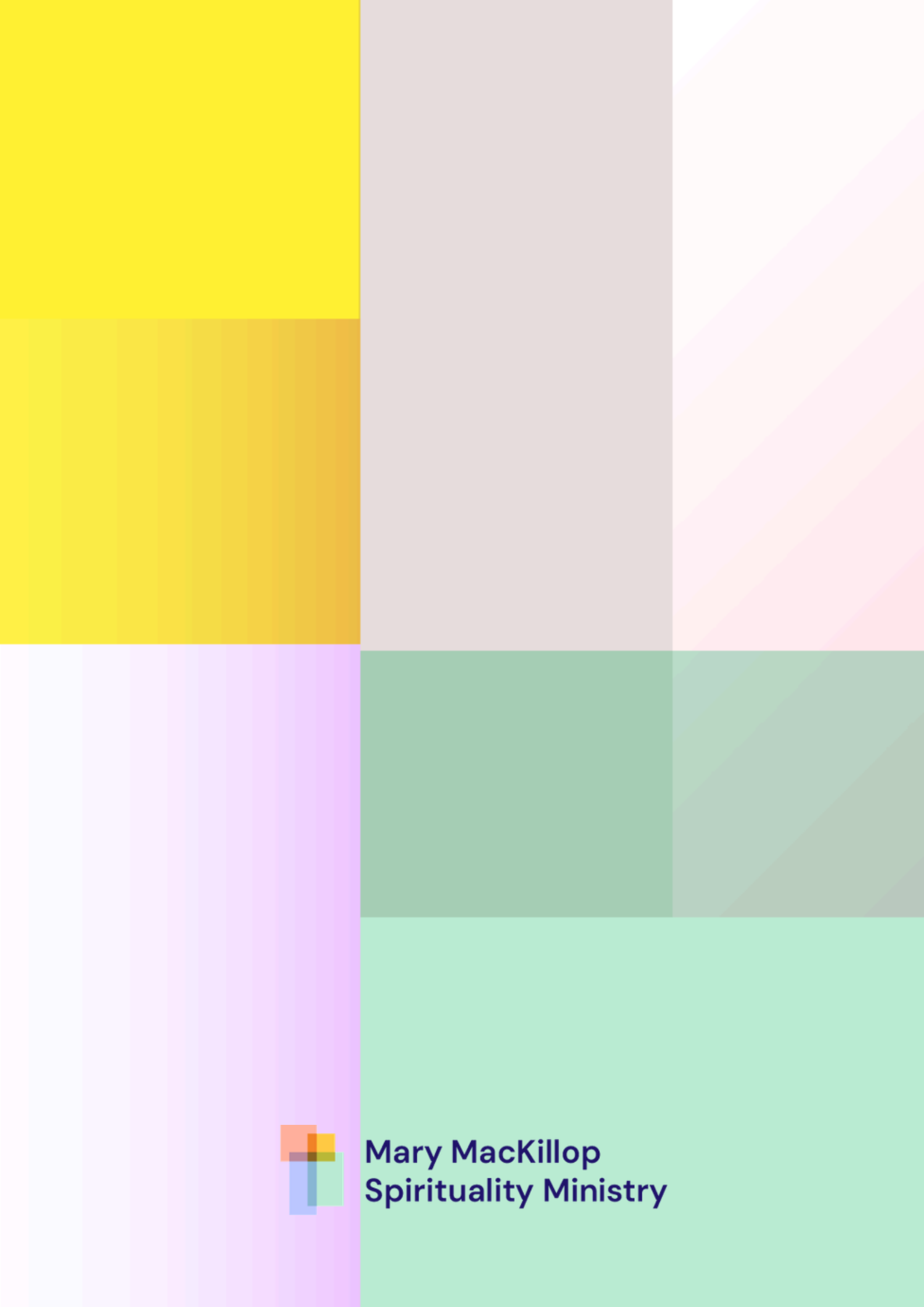
