Mary MacKillop Fund

Mary MacKillop Spirituality Ministry offers opportunities for everybody to experience spiritual enrichment and personal development in a peaceful, spacious, welcoming settings.

While working towards financial sustainability, we are committed to ensuring that nobody is prevented from attending a retreat or event due to the cost. Participants who are unable to afford the full fee may apply to the Mary MacKillop Fund for a discount or waiver.

Early Bird Discounts

An Early Bird discount of **10% will apply to all Reflection Days and Retreats**. For Reflection Days, to gain an Early Bird discount, you will need to register more than three weeks in advance of the start date of the Reflection Day. For retreats, to gain a 10% discount, you will need to register at least six weeks in advance of the start date of the retreat. **Discounts do not apply to Sabbaticals and Workshops.**

Cancellations Guidelines

From time to time, there will be a need to make a decision as to whether or not a program will run. In the unfortunate situation where a Reflection Day, Retreat, Sabbatical or Workshop is cancelled by the Mary MacKillop Spirituality Ministry, a full refund for the amount paid for the program will be provided to registrants of that program.

If a participant who has registered and paid for a program needs to cancel their registration, a full refund will be provided if the participating centre (where the program is being held), is notified four weeks or more from the start date of the program. **Cancellations made within four weeks of the program start are non-refundable.** The same conditions apply if you need to change the date of the program you are attending.
